Polka dots have a very long history dating back to Victorian time. 'Scarf of muslin, for light summer wear, surrounded by scalloped edge, embroidered in rows of round polka dots' appeared in a Godey's Lady's Book in 1857.

In 1926 Norma Smallwood, the first Native American to be crowned Miss American, wore a body-hugging polka dot swimsuit. The resurgence of polka dots were the style. The most famous polka dots of all day-baud in 1928. When Minnie Mouse appeared in her red and white dress polka dotted dress.

You'll also find Swiss polka pots, which is a tufting woven into the fabric to form bump. Dots were everywhere men's tie and handkerchief, kitchen items besides women's dress.

#### STEVE'S KEEPING BUSY






